**Future translators getting proficient in the SDL Trados computer-aided translation tool**

This year, the academy continues participating in the international educational project CAT for Grad aiming to assist universities to train prospective translators with an adequate level of the technological competence.

Sixth-year students of the faculty of translation and interpreting have passed an on-line European framework exam on the SDL Trados 2015 professional computer tool and received certificates of a substantial significance for beginning translators.

The next group has already started to master a new SDL Trados 2017 software version, a group for learning the MemoQ program is being formed.

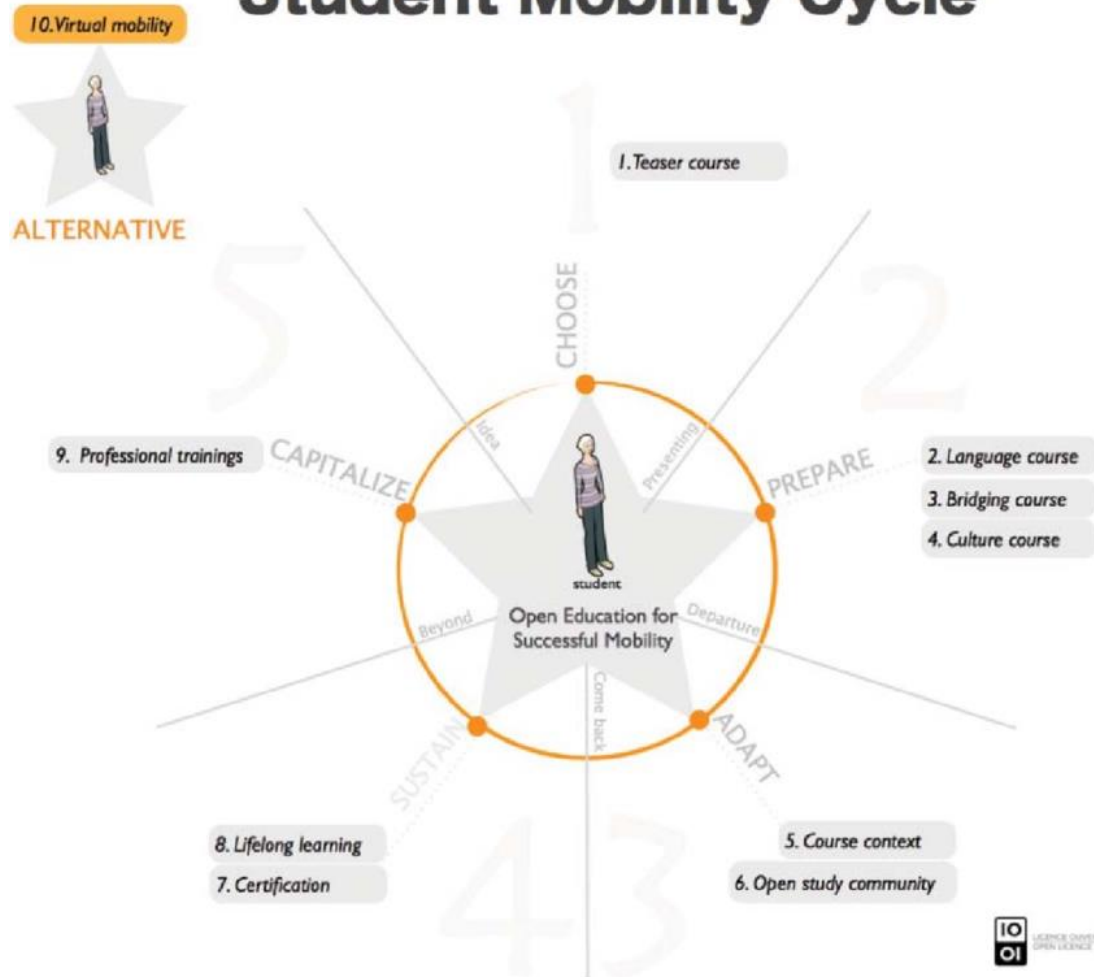


# Virtual mobility

**Virtual mobility in higher education** is a **way of learning, teaching, research, communication, or collaboration**, based on the following characteristics:

- Development of intercultural competence;
- Cooperation of higher education institutions;
- Application of appropriate technological solutions for teaching and learning, communication and collaboration;
- Aimed at achieving academic goals and recognition of the achieved learning outcomes

# Student Mobility Cycle



As physical mobility, virtual mobility is aimed at having **an international experience** leading to:

- learning a complementary course/option which probably is not available in your home institution (enlarged or enriched curriculum);
- developing international collaboration skills in an intercultural context;
- learning to collaborate in virtual environments as you will do in real life work;
- developing a European or even global citizenship.

# The advantages of virtual mobility



- it can engage all students, as there are no physical barriers to trans-border communication;
- multiple universities and different countries/continents can be engaged simultaneously;
- students and staff who for any reason don't want to be involved in physical mobility, can be involved in virtual mobility;
- part-time and employed students, mature students and students with special needs can participate conveniently, as the learning material is conceived for independent, but supported self-study;



# The disadvantages of virtual mobility

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- Some people may consider them impersonal;
- Some tutors and students may need extra training.
